#### 3 Approval of Minutes of Meeting 9th June 2022

### 4 Shopping Centre Update- Centre Manager Ben Horsburgh

Hoping that the issues re queuing at Lloyds Chemists will be resolved soon. Cllr Walker asked if they are still closing at lunch times and said that the stipulation from NHS Grampian is that the closure of the Arnhall branch during August would mean the shopping centre one would not close at lunch time.

Costa Coffee had been letting Lloyds customers use their toilets but this has now been stopped for operational reasons.

Youths had been up on shopping centre roof on the previous Sunday, police took a long time to arrive. Mervyn will speak to Ben about getting the Police to do more regular patrols at shopping centre. Holiday Inn are using the living wall as backdrop for wedding photos.



The worst pot holes in car par will be sorted when contractors are available – work expected to commence in Sept.

Mervyn offered congratulations to Ben who has been nominated for an industry award, largely thanks to the completion of joint MAPP/WECC/Rotary projects

### 5 Matters Arising/ Actions Update

- **1. File Share Options** (Malcolm) Malcolm has advised Gordon & David how to create another One-Drive account if already got one, so they will test this.
- 2. Larg/Broadstraik Park (Malcolm) The meeting in the Park planned for 3<sup>rd</sup> July was postponed. Some of the title deeds for residents adjacent to the park state that they own part of the Park but it is to be adopted by the Council. The grass is being cut by Council and residents.
  - 3. Safety barriers on path to Kirkton of Skene- The request for a site meeting with Brian Strachan of Roads dept. will be re-issued. Cllr Walker advised that some safety measures have been authorised. Mervyn will contact Ann Overton to get details of this. He will also update Fiona Bick that the site visit will not also now include looking at the flooding issue.
  - **4. Academy Outreach-** below notes from Mervyn were circulated

### Rough Notes re Meeting with Academy Representative 21/6/22

Elaine and I met with Malcolm McMillan at the Academy. We didn't get to speak to the head teacher at this time but hope to do so in future.

Malcolm is an Employer School Co-ordinator. There are 23 of these persons appointed across Aberdeen and Aberdeenshire, all school based.

Malcolm and his colleagues have recently been appointed to post (approx. 1- year ago) and his role is still developing. He very much welcomed our initiative and outlined some of his key aims activities.

In wider education the focus has been on 16-24 yr. olds to ensure that they take up roles – in jobs, apprenticeships, Uni/College, other training or working in the voluntary sector. (all regarded as five "Positive Destinations" (PDs). In Westhill approximately 66% of leavers go to Uni or College, while 25% got into the other three options. This leaves about 9% possibly adrift (tbc)

As expected Malcolm's role is concerned with the earlier 16-18 year olds.

With regard to them his aim is to Improve Pupil Awareness generally - of options, and processes to transfer into the 5 PDS and to help identify and improve their "Employability Skills".

He is keen to establish a resource pool of people who can:

- Take part in mock recruitment interviews
- Give a personal account of their journey from school to where they are now. The preference here would be for under 40's to reflect recent/.current experience but this is not to exclude anyone who feels that they have value to add by recounting their story.
- Can facilitate work experience or a job placement

## 8 Ward 13 Councillors updates

#### **Cllr Miller**

Main issues just now are the Lloyds Pharmacy problems, grass cutting and potholes. MP Andrew Bowie will be writing to every resident about Lloyds Pharmacy and the proposed new one.

#### <u>Cllr Joji</u>

Fatima asked if WECC are aware of the 'Impactive' initiative, encouraging residents to get more physical exercise. WECC are not aware of this. Gordon will touch base with Fatima about it.

## 9. Proposed New Pharmacy Consultation

Andrew & Lynne Porter attended to tell us about their proposal for a new pharmacy, which would be built across the road from McDonalds. They handed out leaflets and copies of the consultation questionnaires, and showed mock-up photos.

The Porters operate 5 community pharmacies in Aberdeen. They wish to open a new Pharmacy and the NHS consultation period runs till 26<sup>th</sup> October. A NHS hearing will then determine if it can go



ahead. The response so far has been very positive.

There is no suitable piece of land near centre of Westhill so it would be built behind McDonalds. The planning application is being prepared now to save a delay if/when the licence is granted.

The building will have NHS consulting rooms for minor ailments. Also robotic dispensing which will speed up the issuing process. It will also be the first drive-thru pharmacy in Scotland. They will employ a full-time delivery driver which anyone can utilise. They will be open 8am to 7pm Mon-Friday, 9am to 5pm Saturday, and 10am to 3pm Sunday. There will also be a 'Pharma24' locker outside where prescriptions can be collected using a 6 digit code.

Westhill has 2 pharmacies just now. Other communities in the shire of similar size to Westhill have at least 3 pharmacies. Porters employ enough pharmacists to be able to cover all their pharmacies, including the new one. RGU pharmacy students get work experience with them, some who join them after graduating.

It is evident that many residents are choosing to get prescriptions from chemists outwith Westhill due to the poor level of service from Lloyds.

It is hoped that building work could start in early 2023, so that it would open by summer 2023.

Mervyn thanked the Porters for a very informative presentation.

The Porters then left and WECC discussed the proposal and agreed that WECC members should complete the questionnaire individually. A letter of support from WECC would help a lot. Willie & Becky will draft the letter.

Re the Lloyds Pharmacies issues, Willie will draft letters to send to Lloyds, NHS Grampian, Scottish Gov., and MP Andrew Bowie.

## 10 Environmental Group Update

Report from Raymond & Ken has been circulated, as below in italics:

- Our fortnightly Litter Picks have continued as planned and have been well supported considering that
  many of our volunteers have been away on holiday. Once again, the general opinion was that there was
  slightly less litter about, so we hope this is a trend that continues.
- During the last Litter Pick, I was approached by two men. It transpired that they were Rentokil Employees and had driven up from the Glasgow area that morning on a Scottish Water contract to clean up Sewage at our ponds. They wanted me to tell them where the sewage was. I explained that the pond was still cloudy but had no sign of actual sewage. They stated that they were only concerned with solid material, and none was apparent in the ponds. I then directed them to the burn to the East, as it passed Lawsondale, where I had previously seen sewage spilling from a pipe into the burn. I later met



them again and they said that they had found this spot and cleared away sewage and sanitary products. They said that the stones in the burn at the area had a red stain coating but that they would not attempt to clear that.

Ken will contact Steve Gray to ask if sewage is likely to continue to pollute the burn occasionally, or of it can be sorted.

- For reasons of personal holidays, I will not be able to conduct the Litter Picks in August, but I hope to get a volunteer to stand in for me.
- New bins have finally been installed in Denman Park so hopefully this will help with litter being pulled out by birds.
- I had a request to report that the bins in the Play Park just off Broadstraik Avenue were not being emptied. The Council Officer promptly reported back that this was now being attended to.

Audrey commented that the grass at the Kirkton of Skene cemetery is not being cut/strimmed properly, and the bins are overflowing. She was advised by an operative on site that he Council prioritises burials. Cllr Miller will clarify the situation and if there has been any change of policy.

Malcolm also commented that this week was first time this year that Council had done any strimming in his local park, residents had been doing it themselves. Willie suggested that as part of the CAP we could ask residents which grass areas they would like to see getting cut regularly and which areas they wouldn't mind being left.

Mervyn commented that Ian Mitchell of Landscape Services hasn't yet arranged installation of the new benches for Denman Park that were delivered by Glasdon in May. Mervyn will contact Ian to arrange a site visit to agree where the benches will go.

### Town Centre Information Board/s

An A0 sized map of the town showing the WOT and other walking/orienteering routes was installed on the wall between the entrance to CAB and Nisa on 29<sup>th</sup> June. Another may follow for a location to be agreed.

#### **Ongoing Maintenance / Upgrades**

The Community Payback team was true to its name in June, completing three very productive sessions of strimming, one at Lawsondale and two at Broadshades and Golf club sector. A return visit to Lawsondale has been requested. This summer work is so important to the integrity of some sections of the trail that it has prompted me to think about putting together an annual maintenance and upgrade plan for the long term sustainability of the Trail. An outline of what that might look like follows below.

### Correspondence since last month's meeting

- Issues with lack of signage on the track leading from the B979 [Mason lodge to Peterculter/Garlogie road] to Garlogie have been resolved with Mr Cheyne, Dunecht Estate, DE's tenant farmer and Fiona Bick of ESCC.
- Westhill GC is hosting a Par for Parkinson's charity fundraiser on Saturday, 3<sup>rd</sup> September and have decided to promote a sponsored walk for social members using the WOT. I am liaising with Karen Templeton regarding progress of the works at Carnie Woods and the possible need to use the temporary alternative route.
- Re end of project funding, I wrote to Landscape Services asking for a quotation and consent to locate a
  picnic bench at either Mains of Kinmundy Hill or NW corner of Broadshades. Reply awaited. Updatelan Mitchell has now quoted £800 for this
- I wrote to Burns Construction on 28<sup>th</sup> June requesting permanent reinstatement of the waymarker post on Silvertrees Drive on completion of the development. Reply awaited.



• I am in correspondence with Scottish Rights of Way Society to understand the City Council's obligations to restore the Right of Way through Carnie Woods as part of the clearing works.

#### **Funding Update**

As per the Project report, a penultimate claim for £1,073 was submitted to AC in June and settled in July. £550 is uncommitted. Remaining funds must be spent by Sept 22. Benches or a picnic table are being considered, but the favourite is a stone cairn on the top of Mains of Kinmundy Hill showing distance and direction to surrounding hills and features. I have written to Landscape Services seeking permission to erect a cairn at the top of the hill beside the picnic bench.

I am in discussions with the Community Payback team to construct the cairn.

Gordon commented that some of the cycle lanes in Westhill have never been extended since they were put in but the town has expanded since then. He has contacted the Council about this.

'Paths for All' has funding available for path upgrading (projects in the £10k to £100k range). At moment we have no plans for any additional paths.

## 12 | Planning Matters (Diane Priestly)

Report from Diane has been circulated, as below in italics:

#### Planning applications

Planning application APP/2022/1069 Duncanos decking

I had confirmation from the case officer that the residents of 1-13 Cairnton Court, the block within 20m of the application site, were notified of this planning application

Planning application APP/2022/1062 proposed Cala development at Burnland has been completed.

Drive Thru Gregg's planning application APP/2022/1236 - our comments to be forwarded to the planning officer this week. Having checked this application it is interesting to note that there are no public comments recorded for this proposed development. The comments from WECC will include the apparent lack of litter bins in the application and that pedestrian crossings should now be installed on the nearby roads.

**NHS Grampian** is carrying out a joint consultation with A and L Porter for a proposed new drive thru pharmacy to assess the demand for such a service. The consultation finishes at midnight on the 26<sup>th</sup> October and you can complete the NHS consultation by visiting www.westhillpharmacy.co.uk

**LDP examination process** has now been completed but it is clear from the examination process that it is likely that there will be an argument for both housing and business land in the future for Westhill. By 2024 WECC will need to start looking at developing a Local Place Plan which will dovetail into our Community Action Plan. Aberdeenshire Council are currently developing a strategy for Local Place Plans and once this has been completed WECC will be contacted.

#### **Community Action Plan**

We are in the process of developing the questionnaire to go in the winter Bulletin. Mervyn has also mentioned the CAP link in the summer Bulletin. Jacky Niven has been contacted to arrange another meeting to discuss the type of questionnaire that we need to use and this will also help us to provide evidence for the next LDP. Willie commented that another town was running their CAP questionnaire via the Council website. This option will be discussed with Jacky Niven. Public meetings will also be required.
