WESTHILL & ELRICK COMMUNITY COUNCIL OFFICE BEARER'S REPORT

With daylight hours stretching, it's that time of year to think about using them to best effect. But first, we want to reflect on a couple of significant events since the last Bulletin. Thanks are due to all fellow members of the Community Council and

members of the Mapp team who helped stage our Christmas Lights switch-on event. It was great to see the community coming together in such large numbers, and we hope it was the prelude to an enjoyable festive season for all

At our January meeting, members of the Community Council considered an application for a major wind farm development on Hill of Fare, and decided by majority to express an opinion that the application was deeply flawed and incomplete and should be challenged accordingly by the planning authorities. The initial decision rests with the Scottish Government's Energy Consents Unit.

At the end of January, we held a communications workshop, with the aim of reaching our community more widely and effectively. To start with, we thought it would be helpful to set out the primary purposes of a Community Council so that you could see what we – volunteers and members of the community – should be doing on your behalf.

 Community Councils are statutory consultees on planning applications that affect our area – from the Brodiach Burn in the east to Mason Lodge in the west.

Our other purposes are:

- To ascertain, co-ordinate and express the views of the community, and to take such action in the interests of that community
- to pro-actively identify and assess issues of importance to the community
- · to carry out other activities that are in the general interests of the community
- to promote the well-being of the community
- to offer a channel to the community to voice their opinions on any matter affecting their lives, their welfare, their environment, its development and amenity

To these ends, we agreed a plan for 2024 that includes improving our engagement with the community through our other channels of communication – Website and Facebook – which are not as widely viewed as the Bulletin which is delivered to over 5,000 households and many businesses in Westhill and Elrick plus the nearby villages

Our monthly meetings are held in public, and anyone is able to attend. We always welcome anyone who would like to come along to listen to our discussions, consider an issue or raise a concern.

WECC have been working on the next Community Action Plan for Westhill & Elrick; a document covering five years of ambitions for the local community. As a part of this process, there will be a drop-by community engagement event on Friday 19th and Saturday 20th April at the Westhill Shopping Centre. This event aims to gather opinions from as many people as possible regarding what the priorities are for development or improvement in Westhill and Elrick. It is hoped that this additional piece of research will validate our initial findings and help to determine the community's priorities for the years ahead. We would love to see you there for your opinion to be heard (see centre pages for more details).

We also plan to continue with our existing projects which are only possible with the support of volunteers. These are:

- improving and extending the path network in Denman Park in the spring [see page 73 for more]
- supporting the purchase of tri-shaws to help establish a Cycling Without Age Scotland chapter in Westhill
- planting spring bulbs in many of the town's green spaces, plus planting summer bedding plants opposite the Holiday Inn
- maintaining the width and surfaces of the Orbital Trail and connecting paths using our newly acquired tools [see page 73 for more]

- providing equipment for ongoing community litter picks in conjunction with Rotary in Westhill & District [see page 37 for more]
- erecting the Christmas Lights and planning to assist the shopping centre management company with a "switch-on" event in December
- · working with the local community and local Council to improve the presentation of Larg Park

An exciting and busy year ahead, I hope you'll agree. If you have time, and would like to add your support to any or all of the above, please consider becoming a member of the Community Council, or contact the relevant project leader if your interest is project specific. You'll be warmly welcomed. Membership of the Community Council is apolitical.

Denman Ponds Nature Restoration Project – February 2024 Update

Aberdeenshire Council has secured monies from the Scottish Government Nature Restoration Fund for a project to treat the surface water entering the ponds and to start bringing the three ponds back to health following pollution incidents in previous years.

The November 2023 tender process was unsuccessful, so the project has been split into two phases and a local contractor has successfully tendered for the phase one works.

Further updates will be provided to let people in Westhill know the start and finish dates for the phase one contract works to improve the quality of the water entering the ponds.

Scottish Water are also undertaking works to the surface water drainage network in Westhill which will improve the quality of the water entering the ponds at Denman Park.

The Denman Park ponds receive their water from the road drains in those areas of the town from Morven Crescent near the golf course in the north, Westhill Drive in the east, to Westwood Grove in the west

If you live in the middle section of Westhill then you can help improve the ponds water quality by checking that your roof and garage rainwater drains are not connected to any washing machines, toilet or kitchen outfall pipes. Likewise, people doing external painting, waterproofing or cleaning works must not pour the leftovers or the water used to clean the brushes and rollers into the kerbside road drains as this will flow into the ponds.

Scottish Water continue to investigate the surface water drainage system to identify any current sources of pollution arising from wrong connections and inappropriate fluids poured down a road-side rain-water drain and are taking actions to prevent these problems.

Consultation launched on Aberdeenshire Council's Development Plan Scheme 2024

Every year Aberdeenshire Council must prepare and publish a document called a Development Plan Scheme. This sets out the anticipated programme for the production of the Local Development Plan and how people can get involved in its production. Recent changes in the law mean that the council must publish a draft of this document and consider the views of people who wish to comment.

Aberdeenshire Council has now started that process by publishing the draft Development Plan Scheme 2024 on its Engage Aberdeenshire LDP consultation hub and are inviting residents and more than 700 community groups and businesses within the area to give their views. A brief survey is provided to assist people in responding to the consultation which is available online here: https://engage.aberdeenshire.gov.uk/hub-page/local-development-plan-2027. The consultation runs until March 15th, with the results being presented to the council's Infrastructure Services Committee for consideration on May 16th.

The Development Plan Scheme sets out the timetable for the plan's production and focuses on how people can get involved in the current stages of work.

Early Years Provision and the Learning Estate

At the most recent Education & Children's Services Committee on 1st February, there were two significant decisions taken.

The first was for the council to confirm a date on which they would cease being direct providers of Out of School Care (OOSC) after the decision to cease was made by the Committee back in May 2023. This will have an impact on the children presently using the Westhill service. Parents have been encouraged to get in touch with the Early Years team at Aberdeenshire Council to enable further discussions with alternative providers before the termination date of 6th July and we have asked for regular progress updates from the Early Years team.

The second significant report was the "Learning Estates Strategy – Movement Towards a Sustainable Estate". This strategy paper outlined the aspiration to have a "council estate that is fit for purpose to provide modern public services that meet the current and future needs of our communities". The Committee previously agreed that the ideal occupancy level of a school would be approximately 85%, but that a target occupancy band of between 75% and 90% is a reasonable aspiration. The Learning Estates Team will carry out detailed option appraisals for each school cluster with Westhill being one of the clusters in phase 1. Current evidence shows that Skene Primary School is operating on 49% capacity and likely to fall to 33% by 2029.

The programme of engagement has already begun with schools and the wider community with an online survey which closed on Friday 23rd February. Targeted public meetings in response to feedback received will follow in due course.

Pavement Parking

As many of you will be aware legislation is now in force to prevent parking on pavements. This is a council, rather than police enforced law and Aberdeenshire Council are already enforcing this with warnings and fines having been issued.

There is still evidence suggesting that the message is not yet getting through regarding this new legislation, but this is of course not an acceptable excuse for continuing to utilise pavements for parking purposes.

If you are tempted to park on a pavement, even for a brief period of time, you are opening yourself up to the potential for these fines to be levied, but I would also ask you to consider all road users before committing this infringement. Parents with prams and pushchairs and mobility impaired people cannot navigate around cars that are blocking pavements and frequently find that they have no alternative other to go round the car on the road which unnecessarily exposes them to added danger. Together, lets make Westhill safer for all road users.

Aberdeenshire Council Budget

At the time of writing, the final budget for financial year 2024/25 is not known, but with the added pressures from Holyrood, there is no doubt that some services will have to be significantly cut to even cease in their current form.

These decisions are never easy, but this year, the budget process has involved public consultation in terms of what people want to see as services they cannot do without. The process has taken these views into consideration whilst formulating plans, but we know that not everyone will be happy with the final outcome.

By the time of distribution of the Bulletin, the full effects will be known as this will be determined during the February cycle. Do not hesitate to contact me if you have any concerns over service levels going forward.

Winter Weather

Once again, Westhill, together with most of Aberdeenshire had significant snowfall in January which undoubtedly caused individual hardships. However, it was noticeable to me around the Ward that road and pavement treatments were quicker and more widespread than they have tended to be in the past. Testament to this is that I did not receive a single email during the period of severe weather. If you did experience issues or were not happy with the level of service provided at this time, please write to me, and let me know.

Councillor Surgeries

Councillor Ron McKail and I are continuing to hold monthly surgeries at Westhill Library. These are held from 10.00-11.00 on the 2nd Saturday of each month. Whilst no appointment is necessary, you can contact either of us to set up a specific time if you want to guarantee availability. If you are unable to attend the surgery, I am happy to arrange meetings at mutually convenient times if you contact me directly. The next surgery will be held on Saturday 9 March at the library within Westhill Primary School.

Parking Your Wheels on the Pavement Will Result in a £100 Fine

According to emails and phone calls I've received, there are (apparently) some car owners in Westhill who are unaware that from the middle of December last year parking your car on the pavement is prohibited and can carry a fine of £100, reduced to £50 if paid within 14 days.

This Transport (Scotland Act) 2019 is enforceable across Scotland with the legislation stating that stationary vehicles must not have any part of their wheels on any part of the pavement. The intention being to make our pavements and footways more accessible for everyone by tackling inconsiderate and obstructive parking.

Provision is made in a limited number of circumstances where pavement exemptions do not apply and Aberdeenshire Council has signposted some nine streets across the Shire. None of these are in Westhill. Pavement parking offences are the responsibility of local council enforcement officers who will issue penalty charge notices to the registered owner of the offending vehicle.

Did Your Wheelie Bin Blow Over in the Recent High Winds?

Bin Lid straps to secure the lid and prevent its contents from littering your street particularly in situations of high winds can be obtained for free from the Westdyke Recycling Centre. (Walk-ins without booking at WRC are at 1200 to 1230).

Protect Your Email Password from Cyber-Criminals by using Three Random Words

At a recent Garioch and North Marr Community Group meeting the guest presenter stated that over £1,000,000 per month is scammed by cyber-criminals in the Grampian Police Division (CityShire/Moray). Victims possibly being us or our neighbours, reinforcing the point that when using the internet we need to be on our guard if we don't want to be hacked.

Secondly a further approach used by cyber-criminals to access our personal information is through a weak email password. Guidance issued by the National Cyber Security Centre is to pick three random words interspersed with different types of characters including numbers, symbols and punctuation marks to create a unique password. Making the password as long as possible makes it harder to crack. Changing your passwords periodically on emails and other e-accounts is also highly recommended. Further information on three random words for protecting email and social media passwords can be found at NCSC.GOV.UK.

Litter Picking Update

It has been over a year since litter picking featured in the Bulletin, but that's largely been down to the absence of a feature writer! And that's been a



disservice to the small and dedicated army of volunteers who have been busily going about their business these last 12 months keeping our community tidy in the face of a number of challenges, including persistent litter droppers, storms and arguably insufficient bins. So we in the Community Council would like to use this opportunity to say a huge thank you to the founder of the concept and our former colleague, Raymond Swaffield, and a huge thank you to the volunteers.

Huge thanks are also due to the Vinespring Church who have supported the costs of litter picking equipment over these last two and a half years, as have our friends at Tesco. Thanks to their combined generosity and by way of perspective, last year there were 15 organised picks involving 23 volunteers, collectively picking for 162 hours. That's at least 162 bags of waste removed from our streets and public spaces. In addition, many of the volunteers go out on their own and pick litter between organised dates. Whilst some might regard litter picking to be a thankless, sometimes cold and dirty experience, with the right kit, volunteers find it to be a very mindful, productive and often sociable experience. In fact, according to research conducted by www.keepscotlandbeautiful.org/springclean, 89% of respondents said that getting outdoors for #SpringCleanScotland 2023 helped them de-stress, relax and unwind. WECC supports tackling litter in our community, but we do it all year round.

Organised picks take place on the 2nd and 4th Saturdays each month in conjunction with Westhill & District Rotarians, apart from the winter months. WECC volunteers focus on the east side of town; Rotarians to the west. WECC picks start at 10am on a Saturday, from Denman Park car park, and last for an hour. All kit [litter grabbers, bags, hoops and hi-viz] apart from gloves is provided. If you would like to get involved, please get in touch. If you would like to pick, but can't manage Saturday mornings, then please also get in touch as we are in the fortunate position of having enough kit to lend to volunteers on a long-term basis. We also have arrangements in place with 3 businesses where collected litter can be dropped off in commercial waste bins.

Several businesses, including the Shopping Centre team, organise ad hoc litter picks in and around their own premises. But at times when Council resources are stretched and so long as unsightly litter in our public spaces continues to be an issue, there will always be a need for community volunteers to take on the fight against litter. The Community Council is happy to be one of the leaders in this fight. We will ask the Council for more bins where needed and have asked for an app that allows us to report when bins are full, just like the app that allows us to report when grit bins are empty.

Join us if you can.

When a politician is launching their election campaign, one of the first things they will do is tell the electorate a little bit about themselves – who they are and what they are about. Their priorities

and values will be to the fore, as well as sharing their background and experience. They might even develop a slogan to help get their message across.

This year, with something like half the world's population going to the polls, there will be lots of hopefuls trying to find ways of cutting through the noise to increase their chances of being elected. And no doubt, some slick advertising campaigns will appear to help them on their way. But all the while the public will be looking to see if there is integrity in what they say.

When Jesus began his ministry, the first thing he did was go be baptised by his cousin, John the Baptist. It was a sign of solidarity. He was choosing to identify with humanity – with those he had come to seek and to save. Even though John objected, because baptism was a symbol of sins being forgiven and Jesus was in no need of that. Jesus was insistent.

As he comes up out of the water, the heavens open and a voice can be heard declaring, "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased". Such an affirmation tells us something of the nature of Jesus' relationship with God the Father.

Immediately Jesus is led into the wilderness for a time of fasting. It might seem a little strange to us. 40 days is a long time to disappear just as you've launched your career, and we can't imagine many politicians surviving that kind of absence today. But, for Jesus, these days were to be a crucial time of preparation. There would be many temptations on the road ahead of him and he would need all his strength to be able to face them.

Finally, when he emerges, he presents a kind of manifesto. He reads from Isaiah — "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour." It's an extraordinary statement of intent and over the following three years (and beyond) Jesus' words and actions all align with this

pronouncement. Time and again he demonstrates both the power and the will to do exactly what he says he will do. And today, the work continues, through his followers and with the help of his Spirit.

If it's been a while since you explored who Jesus says he is and what he is about (or if you've never considered it), why not join us as we reflect on exactly this. We have already begun our journey towards Easter and there is no better time to dig into his words and to all that he did, particularly in the crucifixion and resurrection.



This is the second one he has made and thought that it would be his last, but alas, now it seems that his son, not wanting to be left out, would like one too.





13 April: Celebrating Asian New Year with lots of children's games and various Asian cushions on sale.



Westhill Paths Group February 2024 Update

Storm Damage Update

If the evidence of recent months is anything to go by, we're just going to have to get used to dealing with the aftermath of storms. Storm Gerrit at the end of December was the culmination of a very wet spell and left its mark on Westhill's woodland and stressed the town's drainage network



in a number of locations. Four more well established trees came down at Carnie Woods, crossing and blocking the new path surface; one of them a direct hit on the newly installed information panel at Peregrine Road. Remarkably, the panel was unscathed and, at time of writing, three of the trees have since been cleared by Council workmen.

Other less well-established trees were blown over at Lawsondale. Thanks to volunteers, these have also been cleared in recent weeks. All woodland paths need constant vigilance these days, so if you come across any obstacles, please let us know.

On the higher section at Broadshade and Golf Club, there is no natural water course leading down from the top of the surrounding hills which means that the lower lying land which includes the golf course and residential properties bears the brunt of the cascading water after prolonged rainfall. We are trying to assist with improving drainage in this sector if we can, as any improvement will also improve the integrity and longevity of the path surfaces.

Active Projects

Carnie Woods - Finishing touches

Contractors will be installing benches, picnic tables and a new information panel in the central rest area, and a new cairn and panel will be installed at Carnie Crescent just as soon as the ground conditions improve.

Boardwalk removal: a pilot project in November involving two sections totalling 20m confirmed the tools and techniques required to remove the remaining 200m. Our plan is to begin this in the spring when the ground is drier. If you would like to help and haven't been in touch previously, please email me to let me know.

Denman Park – extension of path network, bridging improvements and provision of additional rest areas

A contractor has been appointed with some tree and shrub clearing taking place before the start of the bird nesting season in March. The main construction work is planned for early spring after the threat of frosts has passed. Updates will be posted on our Facebook page.

Investigation work has also begun to try and trace the source of the **pollution in the ponds**. Please see page 4 for separate article from Aberdeenshire Council and Scottish Water.

Maintenance of Denman planted areas – volunteer support: members of the Community Council met with the Garioch Landscape Officers responsible for Westhill and Elrick on 1st February. In the knowledge that the Landscape Services team is under resourced, the purpose of the meeting was to discuss ways in which community volunteers could support the maintenance of the park's neglected planted areas. The meeting was very constructive and will soon lead to a joint plan of action. If you enjoy this kind of work as part of a social group, please get in touch.

Ongoing Trail Maintenance

Late last year we managed to procure a suite of power tools with the objective of keeping paths free from overgrowing weeds and branches in the spring and summer. Periodic flooding is also a challenge in several parts of town, so we aim to spend time and effort to improve the surface of the farm track on the north edge of Meadowlands, some sections around Lawsondale and a section at the golf club in conjunction with the club's green-keeping team.




SCAFFOLD TOWER FOR HIRE
